A report commissioned by the Center for American Progress and the American Enterprise Institute, for example, finds troubling patterns of inequity among Florida's traditional public schools. This research reinforces findings from prior Center research exploiting school expenditures available in California's School Accountability Report Cards. Employment and income disparities persist for racialized people in Toronto and Canada, regardless of education. They are more likely to be unemployed and underemployed even though they are more willing and available to work. The effect of these inequalities in the labour market is that racialized Canadians are three times more likely to live in poverty than other Canadians (19.8 per cent compared to 6.4 per cent). And how about the fact that one in five aboriginals live in poverty and an untold number live without basic necessities such as clean water and electricity?
