What is the matter with Shakespeare's families? Why do so many of his tragic plays involve injuries and betrayals committed between parents and children, husbands and wives, sisters and brothers? How do these plays respond to changes in the understanding and organization of the family during the English Renaissance? Works by Shakespeare and other Renaissance writers rarely provide a straightforward expression of either older or newer beliefs about the family and marriage. What their texts can show us, instead, are the conflicts and contradictions that emerged as writers examined family relationships during this period. Renaissance records of Shakespeare's plays in performance are scarce, but a detailed account of an original production of *Macbeth* has survived, thanks to Dr. Simon Forman. Earliest known text: First Folio (1623). *Othello* (1604-1605) *Othello*, a valiant Moorish general in the service of Venice, falls prey to the devious schemes of his false friend, Iago. Earliest known text: Quarto (1622). The sweet whispers shared by young Tudor lovers throughout the realm were often referred to as "naught but pure *Romeo and Juliet*." Earliest known text: Quarto (1597). *Timon of Athens* (1607-1608) Written late in Shakespeare's career, *Timon of Athens* is criticized as an underdeveloped tragedy, likely co-written by George Wilkins or Cyril Tourneur. Shakespeare and Stage Directions The plays of Shakespeare are so well written that they seem to leap off the page and come to life. However, the plays themselves have very few stage directions. Perhaps this is because Shakespeare's plays were performed in large amphitheatres that were very simple. Most important to the sense of spectacle were the costumes worn by the actors. These were elaborate, colorful, and very expensive. Therefore, they often purchased these outfits from servants who had inherited the clothes from their masters or from hangmen, who received the clothes of their victims as

This chronological list of Shakespeare's dramatic works includes all 38 plays in the order in which they were first performed. These dramatic works encompass a wide range of subjects and styles, from the playful "A Midsummer Night's Dream" to the gloomy "Macbeth." Shakespeare's plays can be roughly divided into three genres—comedies, histories, and tragedies—though some works, such as "The Tempest" and "The Winter's Tale," straddle the boundaries between these categories. Shakespeare's first play is generally believed to be "Henry VI Part I," a history play about English politics in the years leading up to the Wars of the Roses. Deception in Shakespeare's Plays. Barber's analysis of the Shakespearean family tragedy hinges on moments of failure in Christian ritual, failures that often signal the dissolution of tenuous emotional bonds, as represented in the familial strife of Hamlet and even more thoroughly in King Lear. Focusing his study principally on the latter drama, Thomas McFarland (1981) first follows the plot of King Lear as it elevates the mundane realities of family relations to emblematic and tragic levels.
