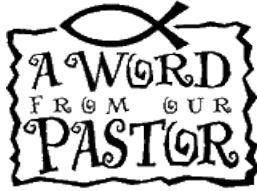

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Matthew 28: 19-20

In the Bible, "the church" is described as believers and disciples of Jesus Christ. A beautiful picture of the church functioning as God intended is found in Acts 2. "And they, continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, did eat their meat with gladness and singleness of heart, praising God, and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved.

Acts 2: 46-47(KJV)

Many people associate the word "church" with a building. But as we see from the Acts scripture, church is living out what Jesus commanded in Matthew 28: 19-

20. The church isn't a physical building. If I had to describe the church in my own words I would describe it like this, "The church was and is the people who put their hope and trust in Jesus Christ. The church was and is believers who allow the Holy Spirit full control over every part of their lives. The church was and is believers who don't mind sharing their testimony so that others will believe, accept Jesus as their savior and enjoy the gift of salvation."

In the coming months, God is providing an opportunity for us to enjoy the same favor the early church enjoyed; adding to the number those who will be saved. Notice I didn't say adding to our membership. God isn't concerned about how many people are on our membership role, but He is passionate about how many people are written in the book of life.

I invite you to join us Sunday, July 8 at 4:30 p.m. as we seek to celebrate what God, through the power of the Holy Spirit, is going to do in our new "Contemporary Worship" service. We're excited about what God has already done and will do. We want you to share in the excitement with us! If you can't join us, pray for God to send the harvest!

School Kits Project**

Education is a key element of survival and success in our world today. In some countries, children don't have books or school supplies. Many have no schoolrooms; classes are held in inadequate or half-destroyed buildings, tents, or even the open air. School kits may be these children's only educational resources.

The RPUMC SOURCE Missions Team UMCOR School Kits Project is planned for **August 5, 2018 at 11:45 A.M. in Fellowship Hall**. Our mission is to create 100 school kits to be distributed to children around the world who need basic school supplies. We also plan to put together 50 school kits to donate to an elementary school in our area.

Each kit costs \$11 or less and consists of the many specific items listed below.

One pair blunt scissors

Round tip only
No plastic scissors

One box of 24 crayons

Only 24-count boxes are accepted

Three one-subject notebooks

No marble composition books
No 3 or 5-subject notebooks

One pack of loose-leaf paper

100-200 page packets are acceptable
Wide or college rule accepted

One hand-held pencil sharpener

1-inch or longer
Remove from packaging

One ruler

12 inches or 30 centimeters long
Sturdy or flexible material accepted

Six unsharpened pencils

One eraser

Two inches or larger

One two-gallon re-sealable plastic bag

The Missions Team will purchase the items and will graciously accept any donations to help offset the costs. Then, on August 5th, we'll need help to assemble the kits. A light lunch will be provided for participants immediately after the kits are assembled. Please consider contributing to the education of children both globally and locally by joining us for this school kit assembly event or by donating money for the supplies. Please contact Kathy Rogers if you plan to participate.

We live in hope that, as United Methodist Christians, we will make a difference in the lives of the children who use these educational resources. We may never meet the children we help with this project, but those who receive these supplies may feel a touch of the love of Christ we shared by making these school kits.

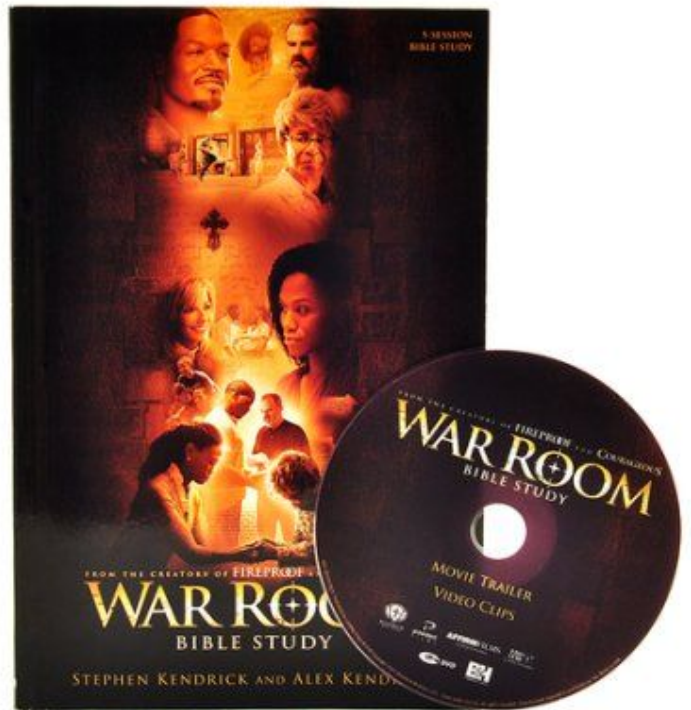
