After 1920, we donâ€™t usually see the rich, velvety darkness that the pictorial photographers, following the cue of Whistlerâ€™s nocturnes, were able to record at the turn of the century. While extreme contrasts of dark and light remain important to visual artists, it is harder and harder to find scenes that have much natural darkness left in them. And the same is true in our daily lives: we spend our nights in a twilight haze even as we sleep.
