The Dawes Act of 1887, sometimes referred to as the Dawes Severalty Act of 1887 or the General Allotment Act, was signed into law on January 8, 1887, by US President Grover Cleveland. The act authorized the president to confiscate and redistribute tribal lands in the American West. It explicitly sought to destroy the social cohesion of Indian tribes and to thereby eliminate the remaining vestiges of Indian culture and society. An Act to provide for the allotment of lands in severalty to Indians on the various reservations, and to extend the protection of the laws of the United States and the Territories over the Indians, and for other purposes. The Indian appropriation act authorized the federal government to set aside additional lands for the reservation system and farther west to reduce the growing number of disputes between settlers and the native Indians. In the late half of the nineteenth century, the appropriation act began to place a growing emphasis on erasing American Indian identity. The Indian appropriation act was presented because the average independent Americans claimed that Indian control over natural resources and land was a severe threat to their expansion and economic goals.
