China's Communist party is intensifying religious persecution as Christianity's popularity grows. A new state translation of the Bible will establish a "correct understanding" of the text. "The government has orchestrated a campaign to "sinicise" Christianity, to turn Christianity into a fully domesticated religion that would do the bidding of the party," said Lian Xi, a professor at Duke University in North Carolina, who focuses on Christianity in modern China. Over the past year, local governments have shut hundreds of unofficial congregations or "house churches" that operate outside the government-approved church network, including Early Rain.
