Or it may apply to these autonomous particular Churches themselves, known collectively as the Eastern Catholic Churches.

ew Rite 4. Homily* The homily set forth in the rite of ordination is optional and may be in the bishops own words. He only has to talk about the duties of the priest. Of course, this requirement is very vague.Â One would think that the conciliar church has an aversion to mentioning the office of the priesthood. The bishop then asks of the candidate, Are you resolved to celebrate the mysteries of Christ faithfully and religiously as the Church has handed them down to us for the glory of God and the sanctification of Christs people? (Does the above refer to the Sacrifice of the Mass? One cannot be sure. Paul Bradshaw presents the early practice of ordination in both East and West by introducing the reader to the principal primary sources, then outlining the nuclear structure of the ordination ritual containing elements common to the ritual for bishops, presbyters, and deacons, and finally considering the prayers and ceremonies proper to each of the orders.

Comparative analysis of sources shows that deaconesses had some functions in the domain of public worship (Liturgy) which were similar to the functions of deacons.
